#### 8. Salcombe Issues:

- Crabfest is on track and heavily subscribed. The celebrity chef for 2019 is Rick Steins son with Matt Tebbut & Mitch Tonks in attendance. Music events also taking place through the day and traders will once again be located on the car park.
- Night time road closure next week noted between Salcombe/Malborough.
- Salcombe suffered a spate of mindless vandalism and theft of street name signs over the half term break. Also, a noticeable increase in dog mess. Noted that both issues decreased significantly once the half term was over.
- The Police and Crime Commissioner, Alison Hernandez, came to Salcombe last week, NT met with her alongside the Harbour Master, Cameron Sims-Stirling. They were able to have an open and honest conversation about the specific-to-Salcombe criminality that our police have to deal with, and she was very interested to learn how different the policing can being a small seaside town, which ranges through the 'usual' domestic issues, illegal drug use, drunken behaviour, vandalism, theft and traffic violations all the way to suspicions of human trafficking and illegal immigrants being reported because of our easy-access via the sea.

#### 9. Modbury Issues:

- There is a meeting next week with Parish Councillors and traders at the community centre. The Parish Council are going to present their ideas/suggestions as to how to attract footfall. A town in Wales has been identified as being very similar to Modbury and they have increased their footfall full details as to how they have achieved this to be released soon.
- More events are being considered for Modbury. Consideration is being given to Modbury being given a new identity. Ideas include arts & crafts/design, something similar to the KIB initiative. More details to be provided.
